Angeloglou to head BQT Solutions

Anastasios Angeloglou has been appointed CEO of Australian technology company BQT Solutions. He takes over from managing director John Genner in the wake of the investment made in BQT by 4C Controls, a US-listed company that is controlled by Switzerland's Rudana Investment Group (*Rust Report*, Mar 8, p4).
